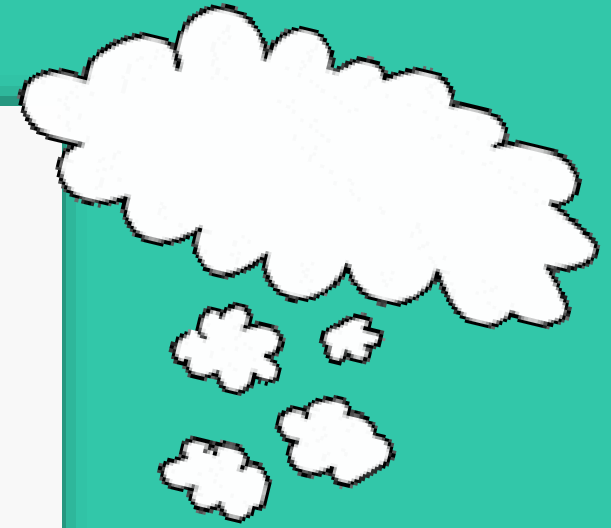

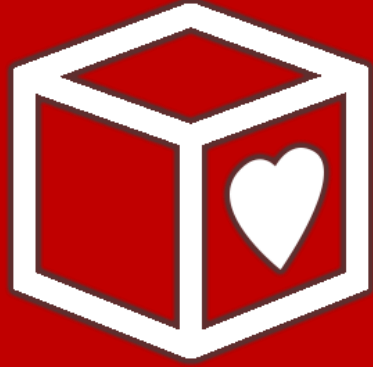
Rule of Law

Breakfast Service

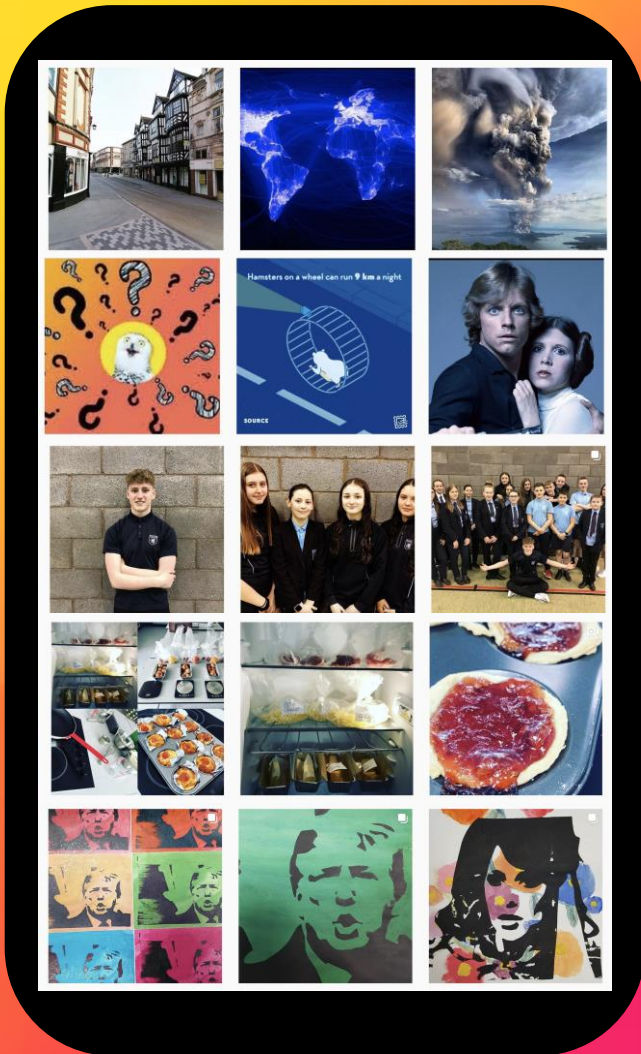
From Monday 13th, the canteen will be providing a breakfast service from **8:00 am**.

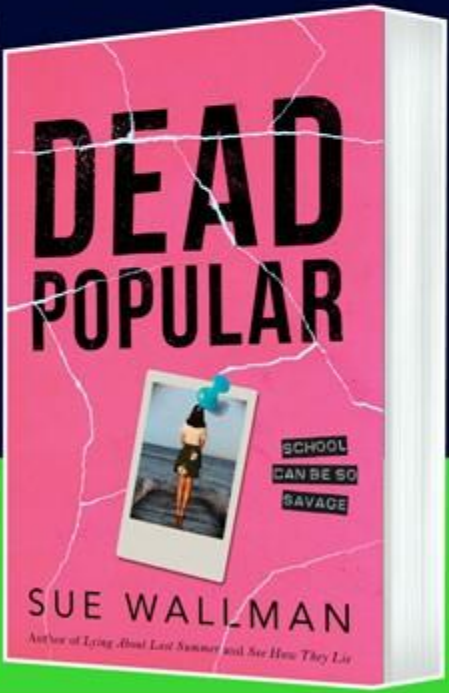
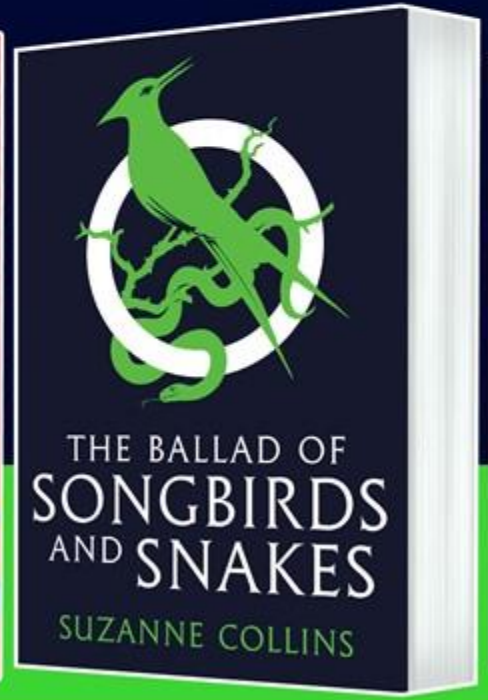
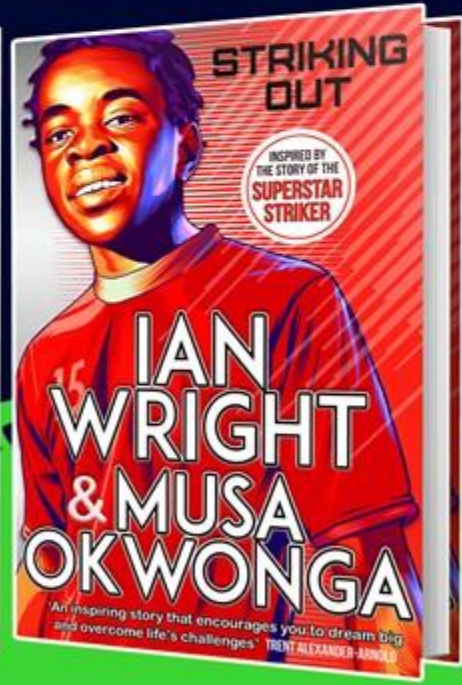
