

# Breakfast Service

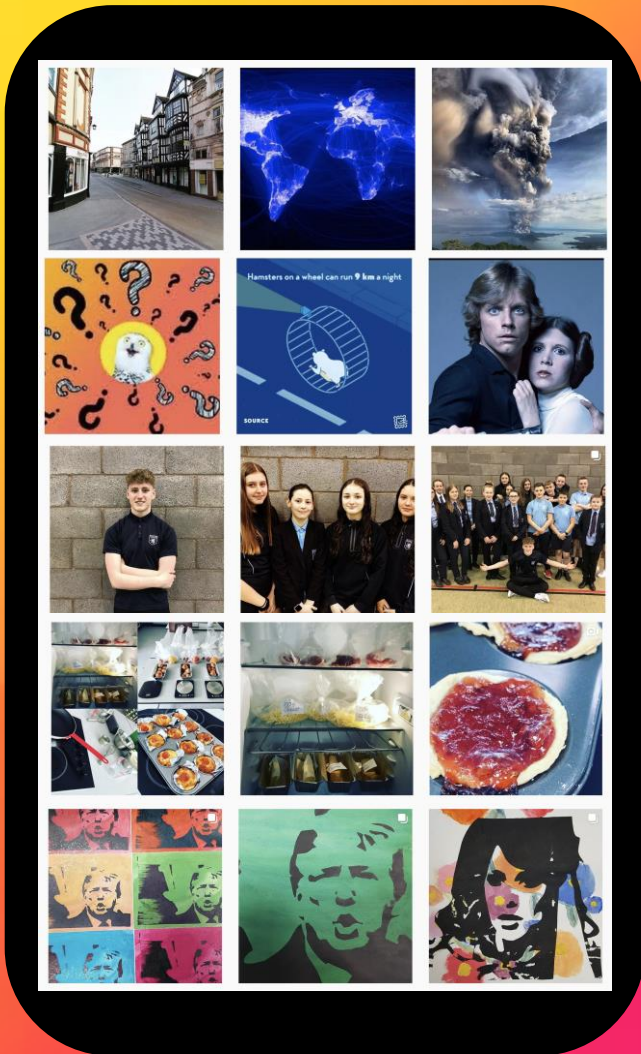
From Monday 13<sup>th</sup>, the canteen will be providing a breakfast service from **8:00 am**.

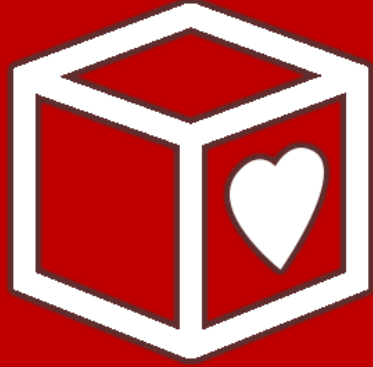

We participate in The Red Box Project as we believe no young person should miss out on their education because they have their period and also know that emergencies can happen whilst in school.

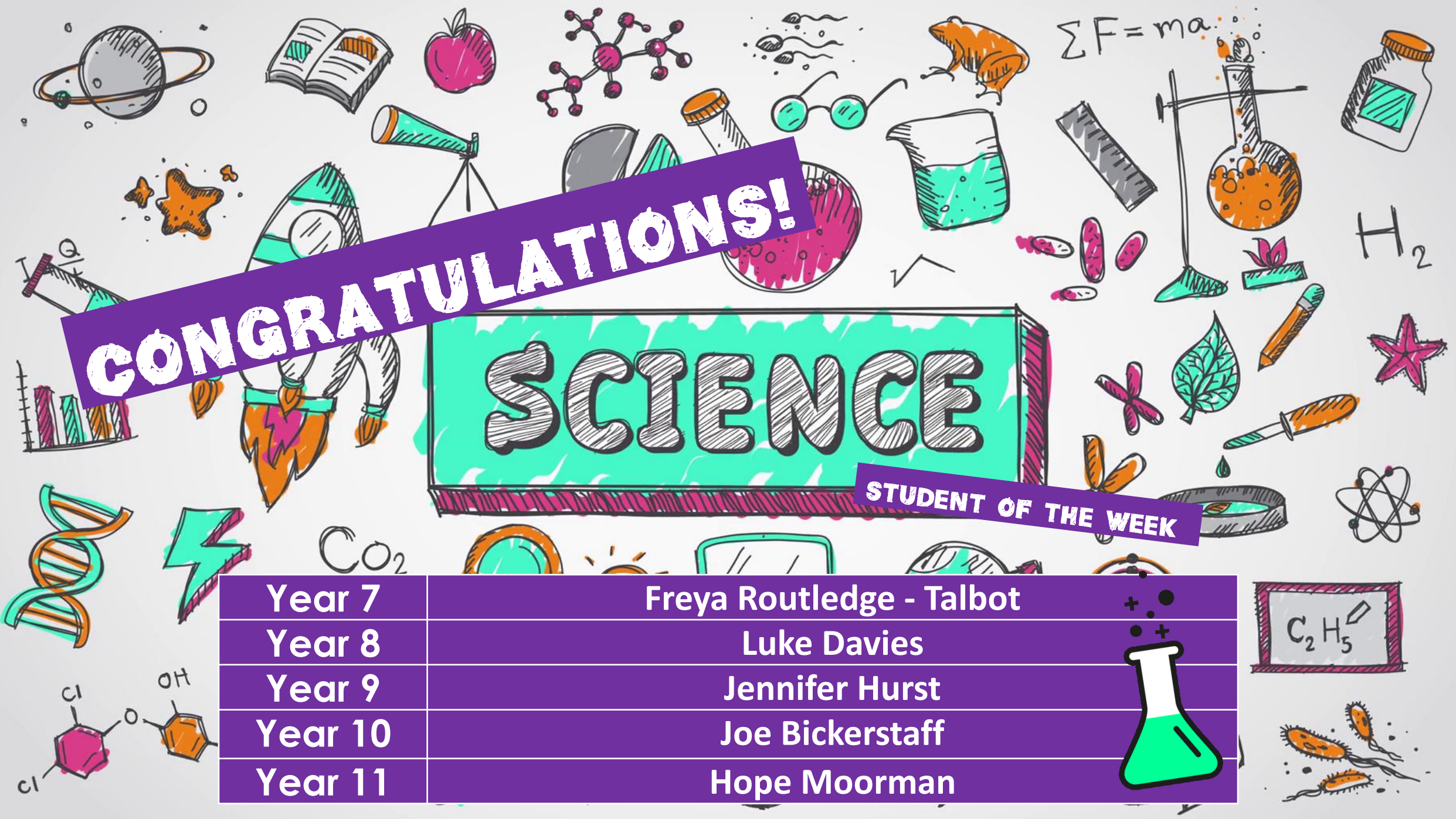

Perfect for fans of real-life drama, readers will love Ian Wright's cameo role in the story. With phenomenal cover art from Benjamin Wachenje.

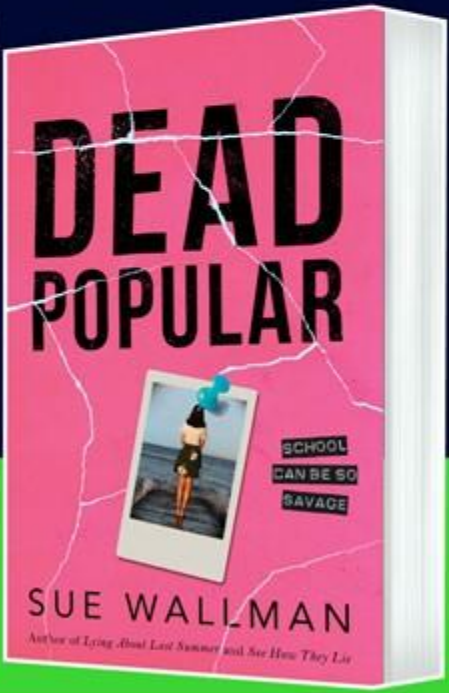
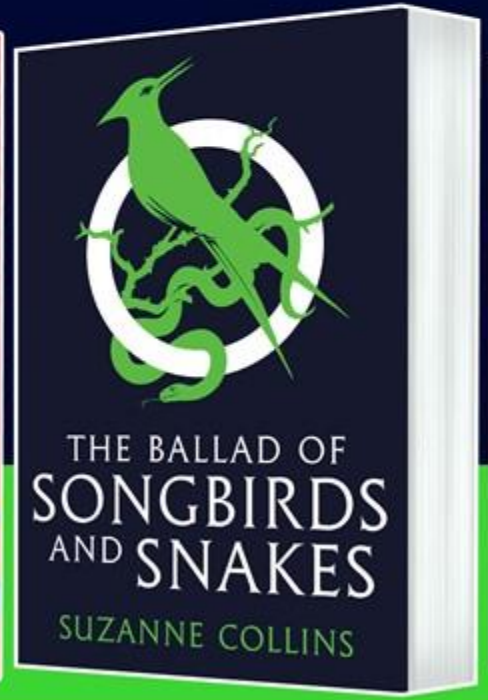
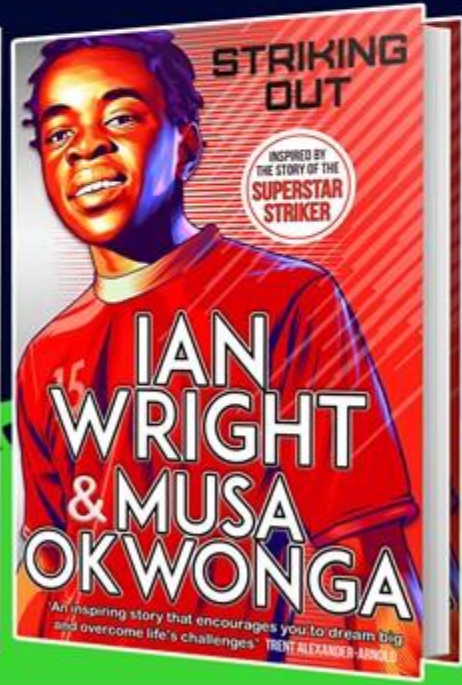
