

Tolerance

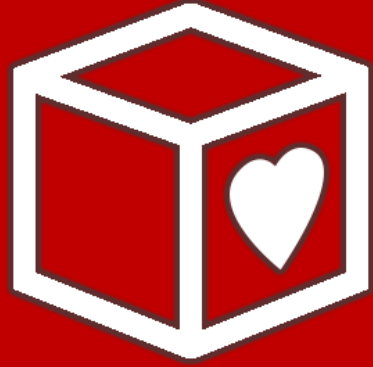
A fair, objective, and permissive attitude to those whose faith, religion and beliefs may differ from one's own.

Breakfast Service

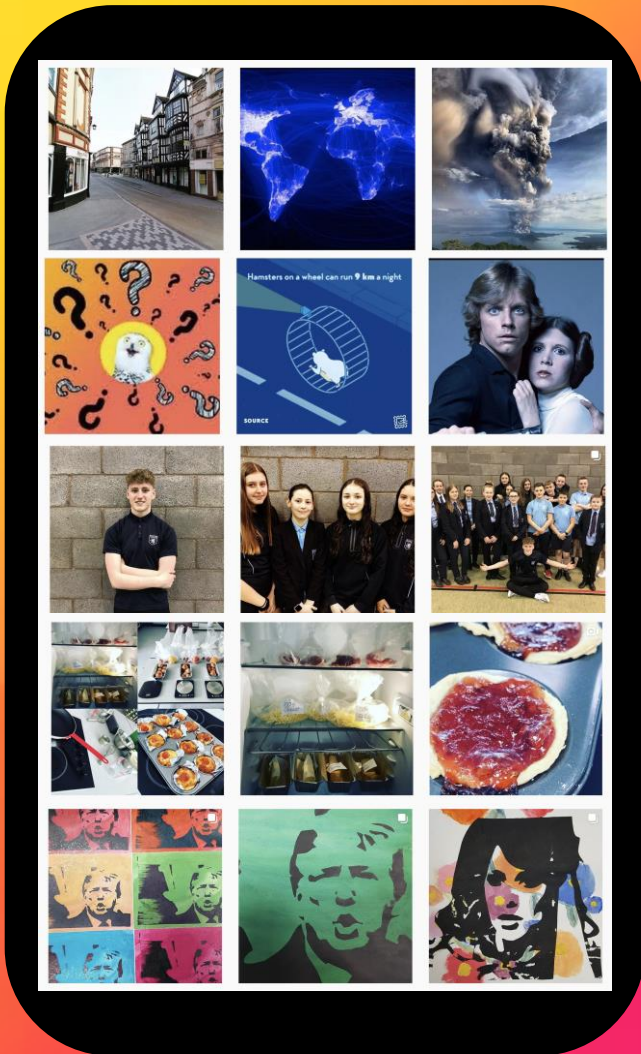
From Monday 13th, the canteen will be providing a breakfast service from **8:00 am**.

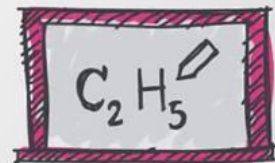

The library is now open after school until 3:45 for doing homework, reading and exchanging books.

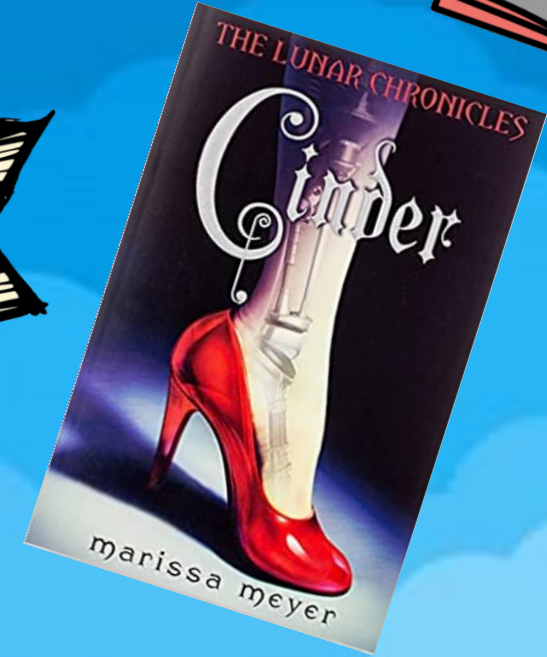

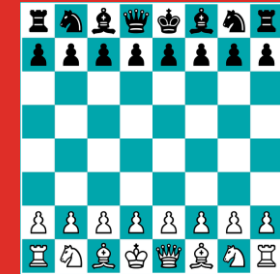

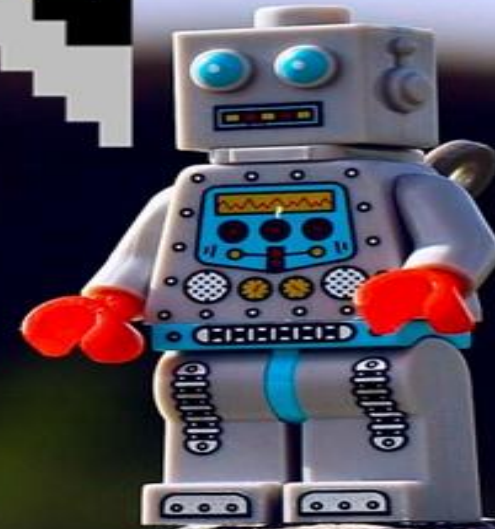
