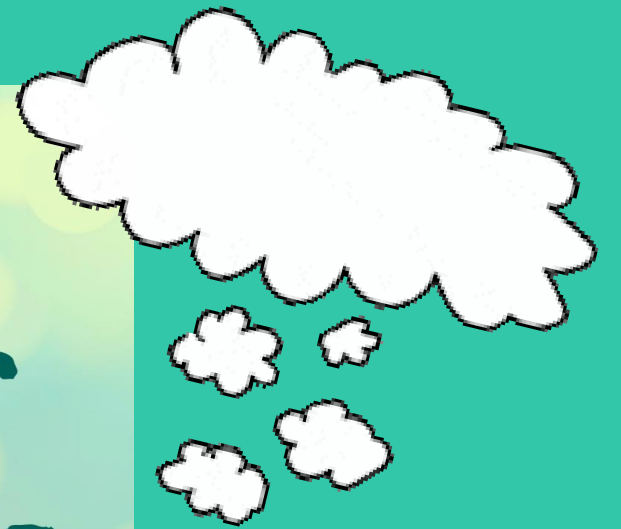

Tolerance

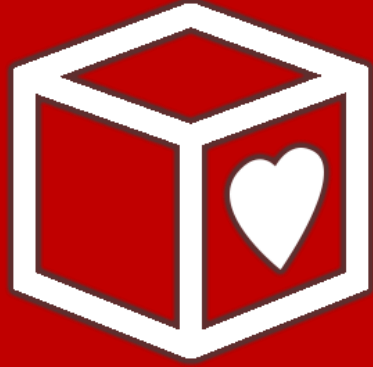

Breakfast Service

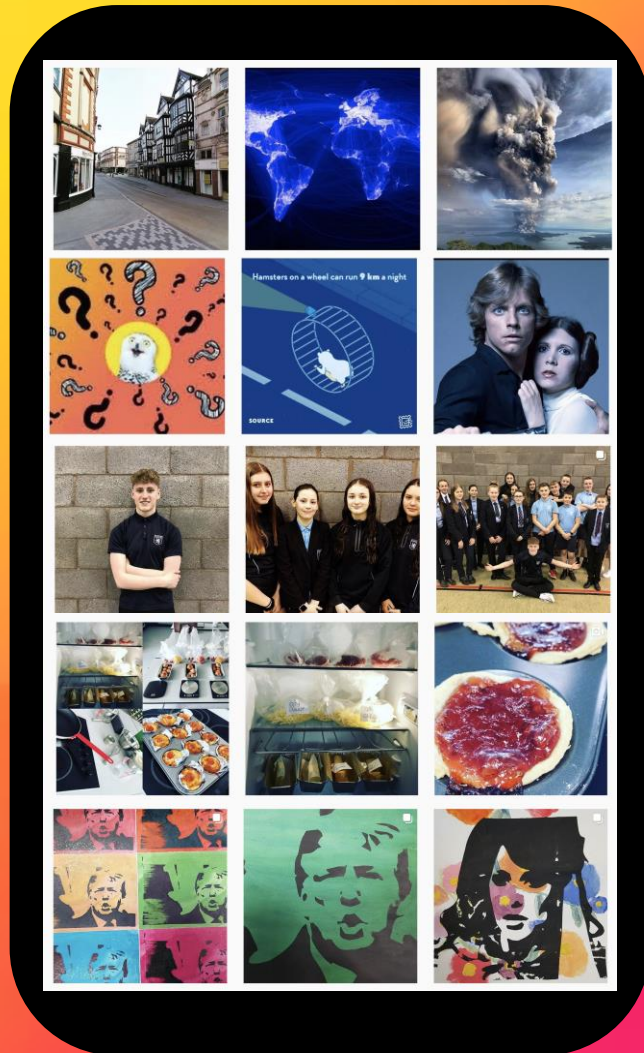
From Monday 13th, the canteen will be providing a breakfast service from **8:00 am**.

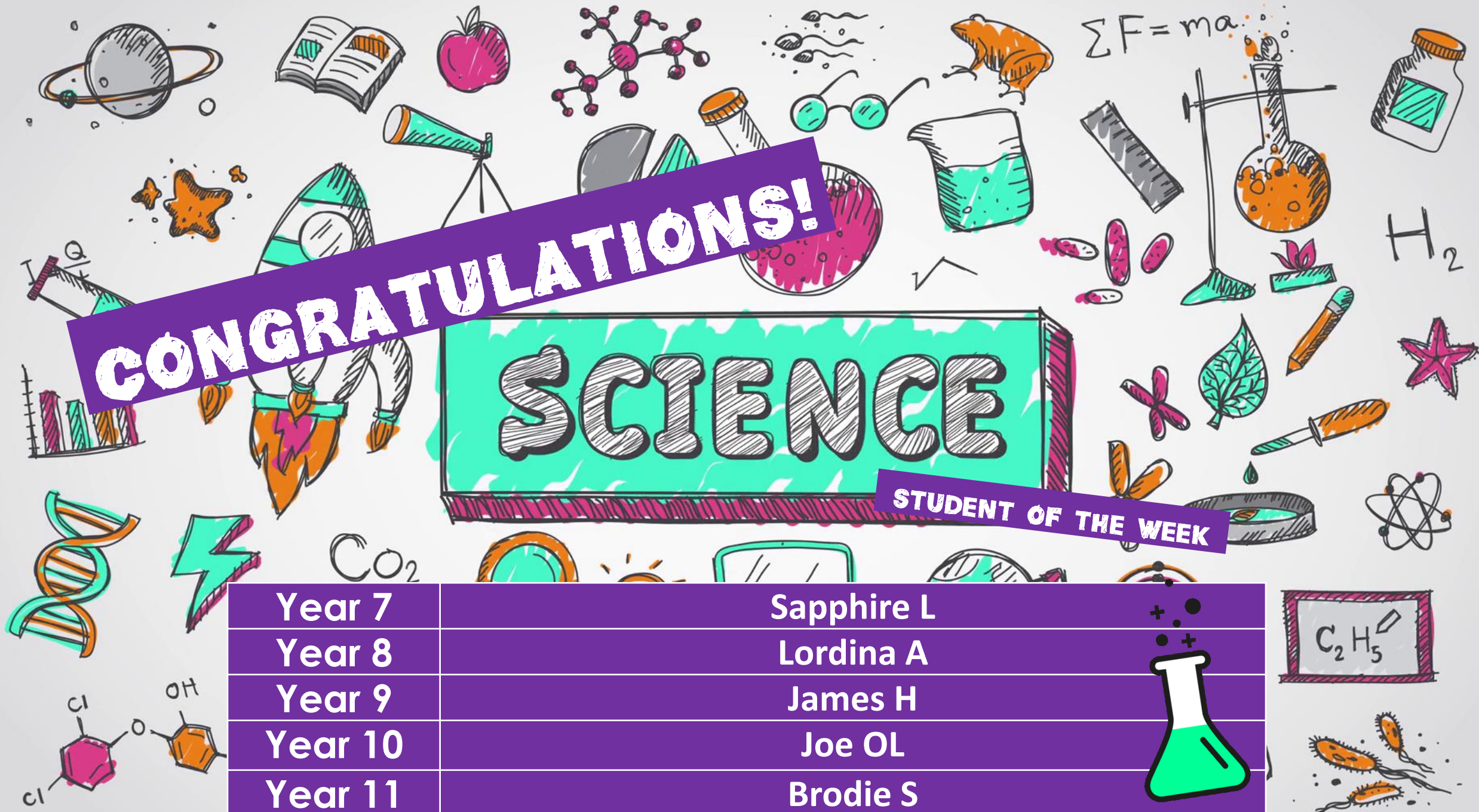

Ghost by Jason Reynolds



Running. That's all Ghost (real name Castle Cranshaw) has ever known.

But Ghost has been running for the wrong reasons -until he meets Coach, an ex-Olympic Medallist who sees something in Ghost: crazy natural talent. If Ghost can stay on track, literally and figuratively, he could be the best sprinter in the city. Can Ghost harness his raw talent for speed, or will his past finally catch up to him?

Read the Run series: Ghost. Lu. Patina. Sunny. Four kids from wildly different backgrounds with personalities that are explosive when they clash. But they are also four kids chosen for an elite middle school running team-a team that could qualify them for the Junior Olympics if they can get their acts together. They all have a lot to lose and a lot to prove. Not only to each other, but to themselves.



Black History Month: Author Spotlight

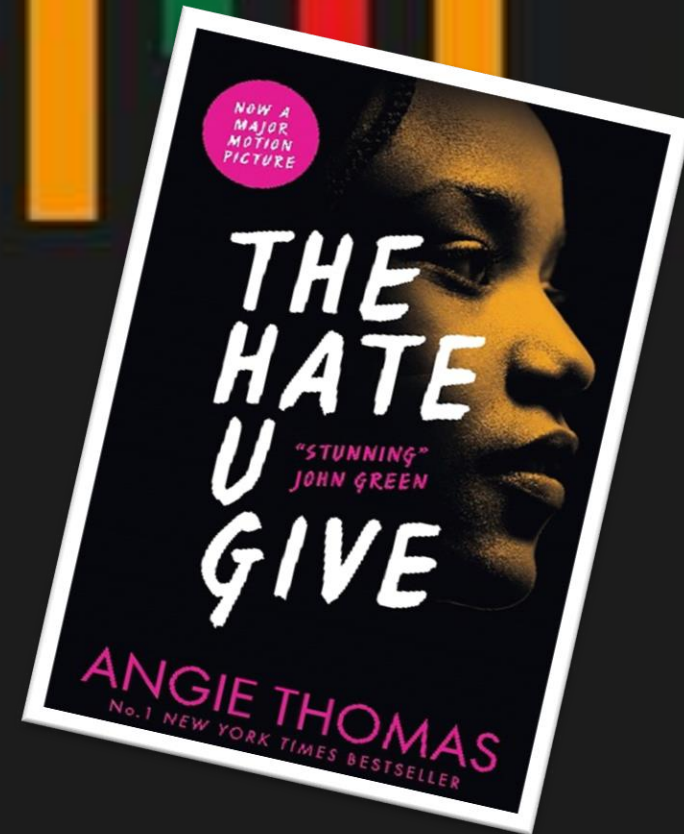

Black History Month: Author Spotlight

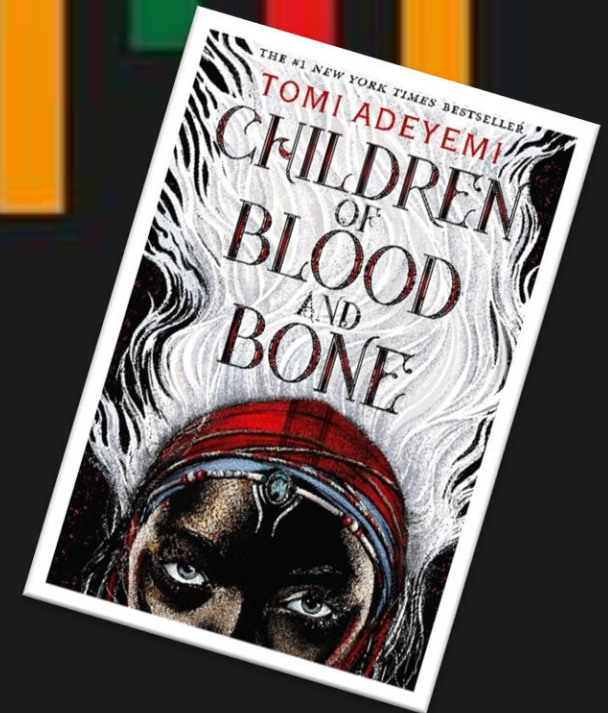
Angie Thomas won the Walter Dean Myers Grant in 2015, awarded by We Need Diverse Books. Her debut novel, *The Hate U Give*, started as a senior project in college. It debuted at #1 on the New York Times bestseller list and won many awards and has been adapted into a film.



Black History Month: Author Spotlight



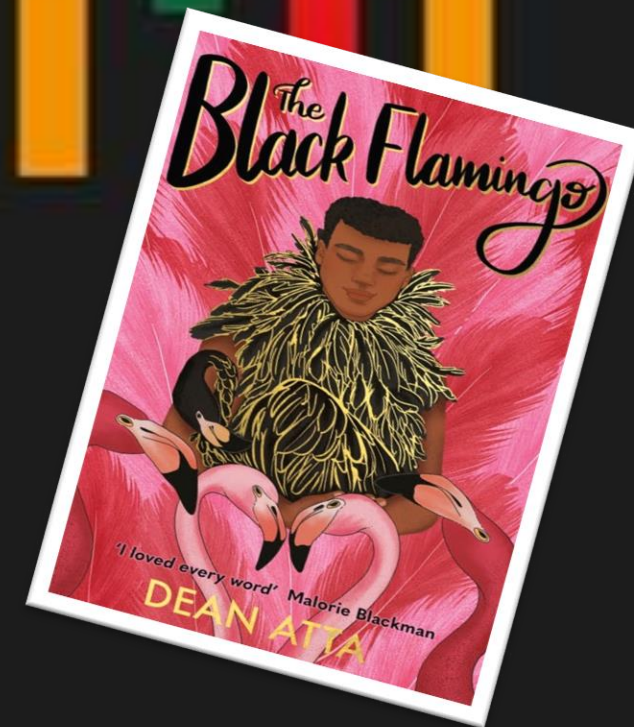
Tomi Adeyemi is a Nigerian-American novelist and creative writing coach. She has a degree from Harvard in English Literature and then studied West African Mythology and Culture in Salvador, Brazil. It was this experience that inspired her breakthrough novel *Children Of Blood And Bone*. It is the first in the Legacy Of Orisha trilogy which won the 2018 Andre Norton Award for best Young Adult Science Fiction and Fantasy. It also won the 2019 Waterstones Book Prize and the Hugo Lodestar Award for Best Young Adult Book. In 2020 she was named on the *TIMES* '100 Most Influential People of 2020' in the Pioneers category.

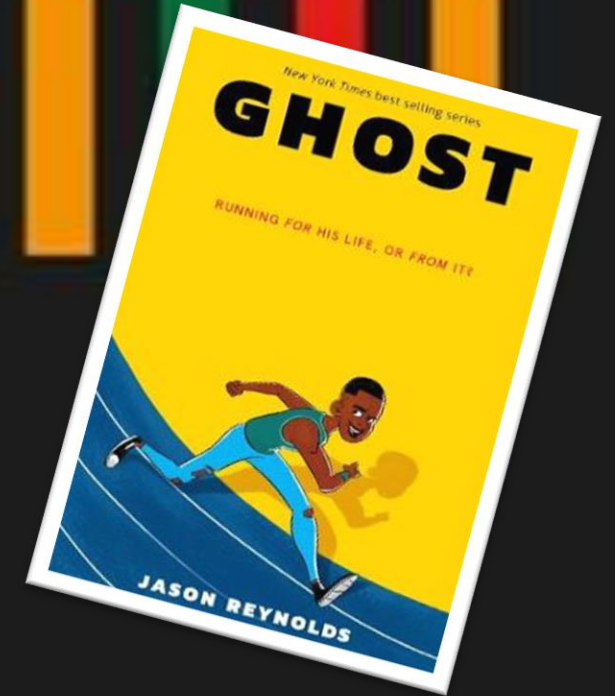

Jason Reynolds is an American author of novels and poetry for teenagers including *Ghost* and *Look Both Ways*, which won a Carnegie Medal. Jason found inspiration from rap and began writing poetry at the age of nine. His reading and writing focused on poetry until he read his first novel cover to cover at the age of 17. He graduated from the University of Maryland with a degree in English.

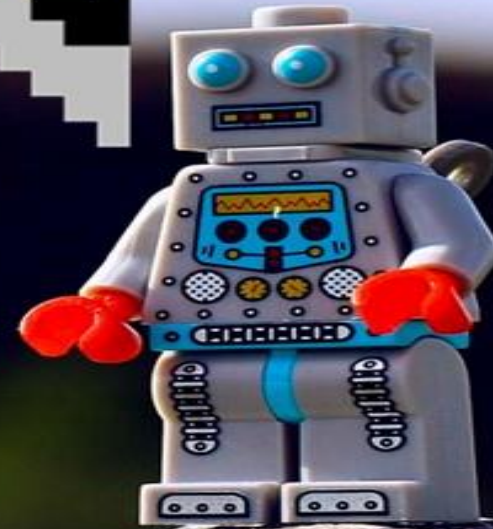
