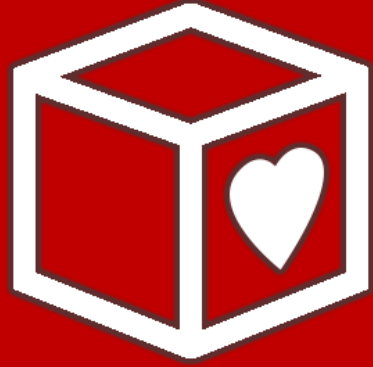


Breakfast Service

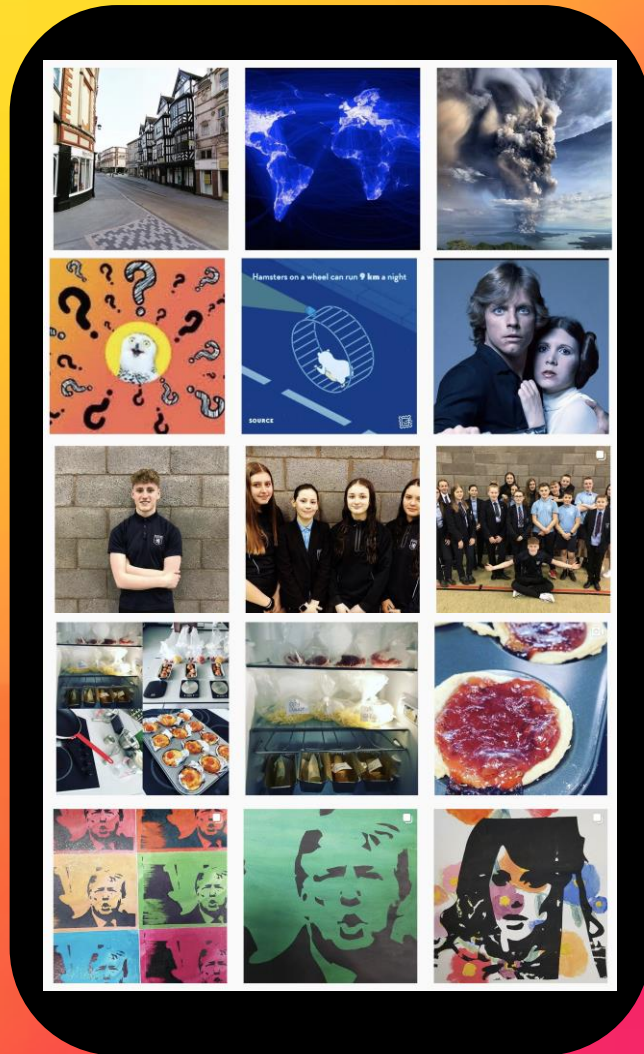


