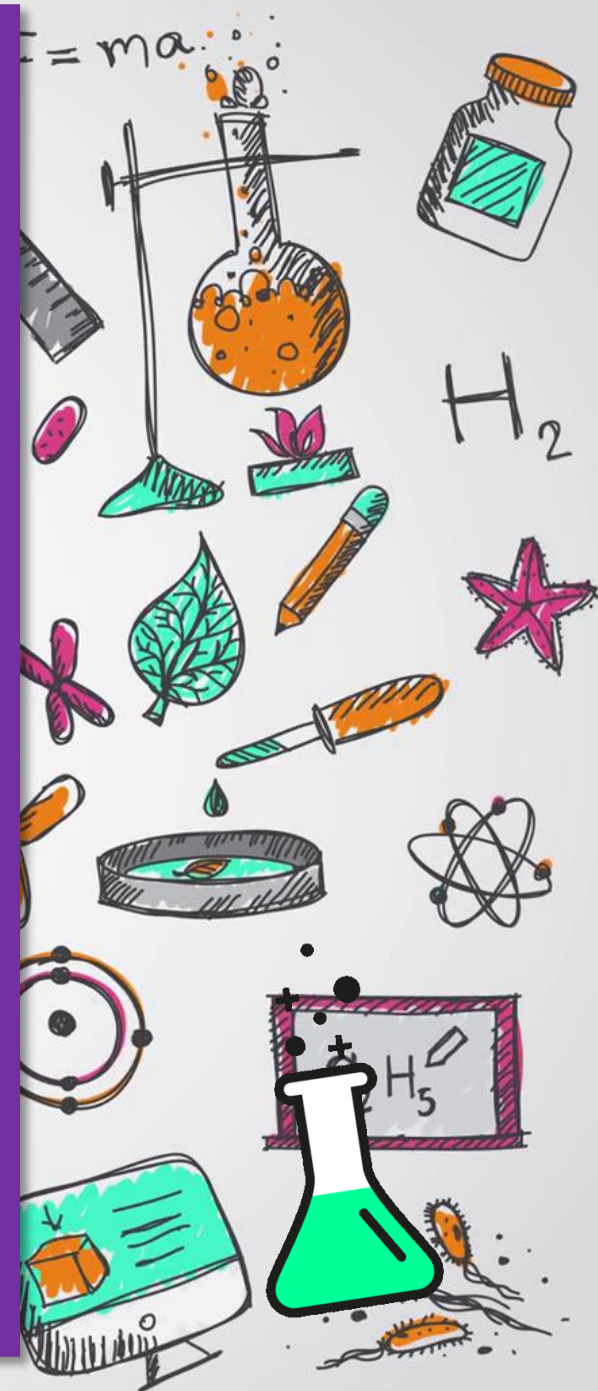
DarwIN Shrewsbury Festival returns

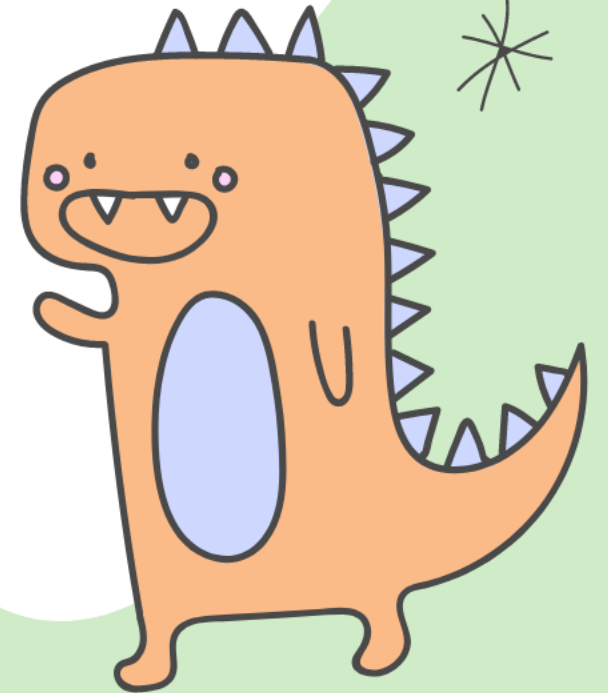
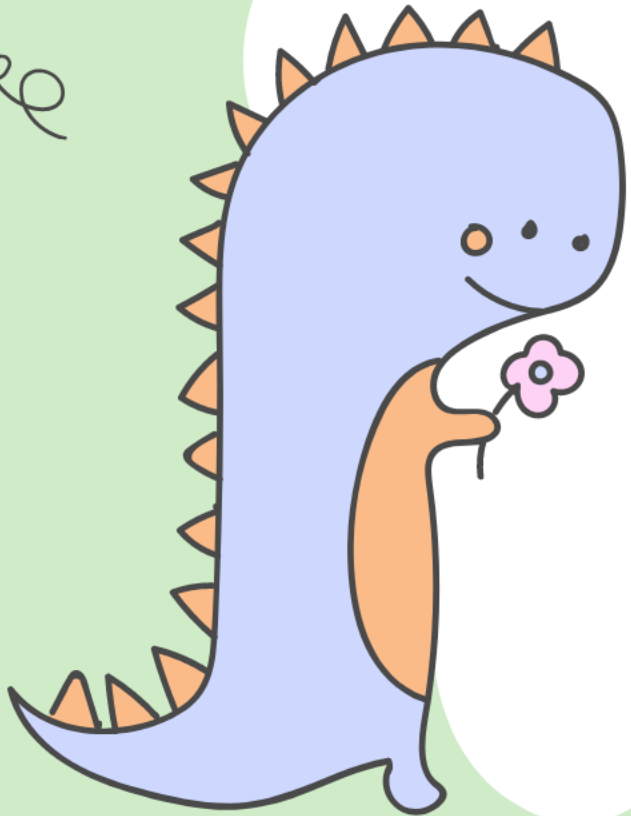
