The grant is a monetary award of up to £500 to support young people in Education, employment, and training.

Starting up their own business or, those overcoming adversities, particularly over the last two years

The grant was set up by the Leader and Cabinet of the council and has run for many years, helping over 250 young people to succeed.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Young people aged from 15 (currently in Year 11) to 25 can apply. You must either live in the borough of Telford and Wrekin, or be a Telford and Wrekin Child in Care / Care Leaver who is currently not a resident in the area.

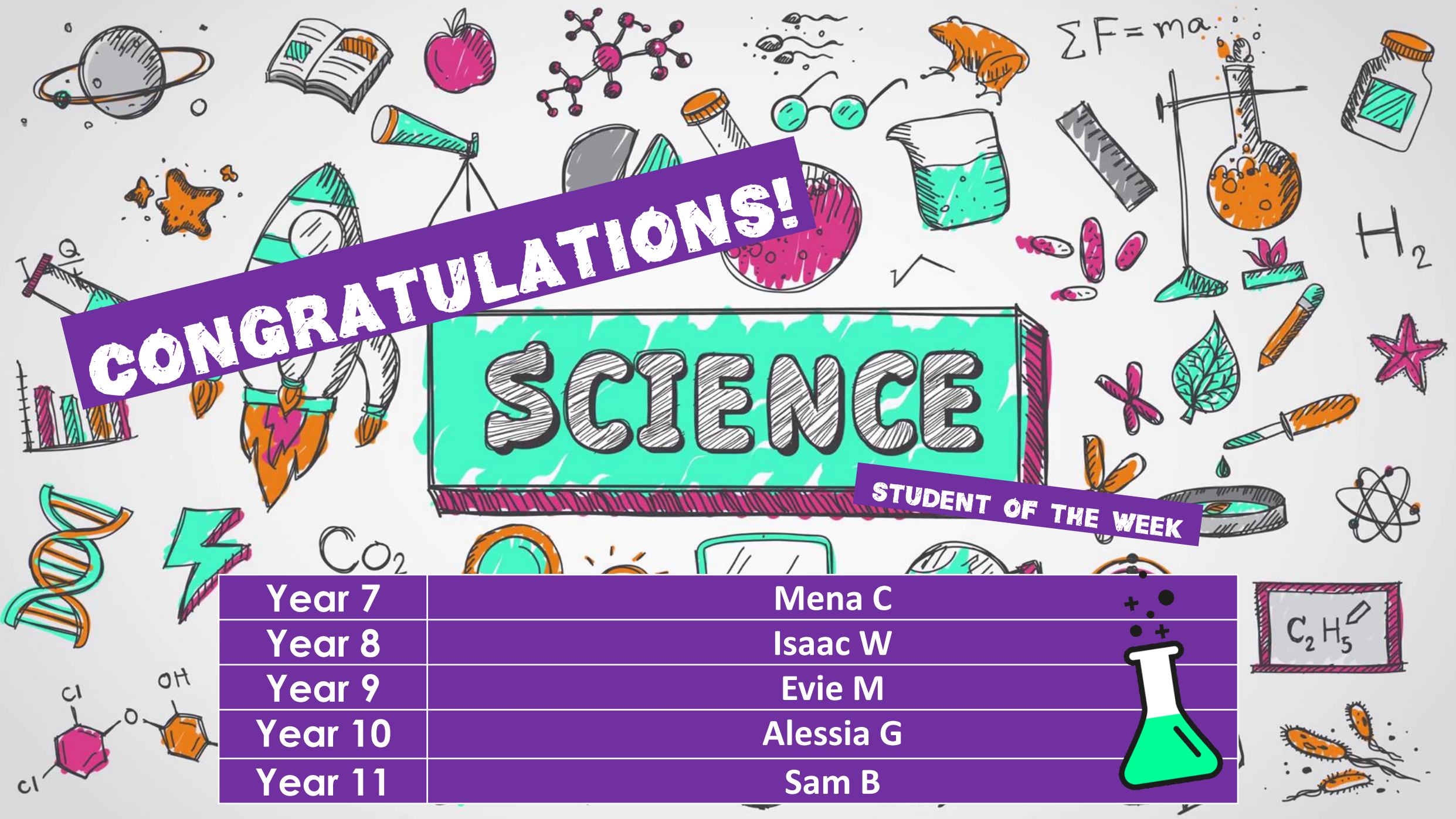
