A spring festival in India and Nepal dedicated to the god of pleasure, also known as the festival of colours or the festival of sharing love.



The grant is a monetary award of up to £500 to support young people in Education, employment, and training.


Starting up their own business or, those overcoming adversities, particularly over the last two years
