### Music task:

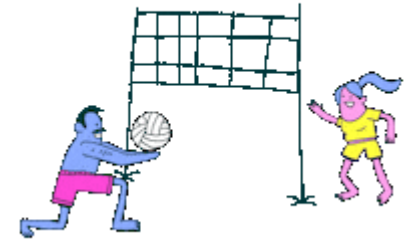
- Devise a piece of music that could be utilised at the opening ceremony for the Games
